The typical denominational church in America is losing members and aging in its membership. Young people and children don't come or if they do, they come sporadically. The reasons have been studied and the results published. Among the more prevalent reasons for the decline are:

- 1. The irrelevancy of the church in a complex and competing world.
- 2. The inability of the church to communicate effectively.
- 3. The expectations members have of clergy and staff that are believed to be unmet.
- 4. The failure to clearly preach and teach the Bible.

There are studies and guides giving practical steps we can take to overcome these defects and at least give hope for growth. I have been studying the suggestions and offer a few we can try.

Good Preaching -I work hard to preach from the Bible and to be true to the Word. I am amazed how every text has layers and insights often missed with surface reading. I believe in "peeling the onion" to see what God wants us to hear and how God wants us to use it today. I know from experience that each time I study a passage, new truths emerge and new applications arise. I also believe in concrete examples. Our "Time at the Steps" is an example of how we can take something simple and use it to let God's word reveal a new way to see God's word. This example of preaching is memorable; you'll talk about it and you will remember it. I'm sure some will remember the use of airplanes and balloons and broom sticks and running. More is coming.

Improved Communications —We need to be sure we can reach every person. I have asked the Session to upgrade our electronics and our "in church" systems so we can present everything we do live to the world in an effective and interesting manner. For those not technically savvy, I want us to invest in devices that can be "loaned" to those in need so

that all may be on the same page. For those who live by technology, I want to be able to communicate with them daily and in their language.

THE PREACHER'S CORNER

Intentionality Toward Visitors—Here, I want us to have a packet available for any who might come. The packet will have information and gifts. I want us to follow up each of the first three visits with an immediate, same day, personal response.

Special Attendance Sundays—Here, I want us to set aside three or four Sundays a year when we invite a friend to come with us. And here's a real deal. I will give half of a \$10 Dollar Bill to each guest who comes, and if they come back, I will give them the other half or I will exchange it for half a \$20 and will give the other half, if they will come a third time ---this time on their own, I will give them the other half or we can put the \$20 in the collection plate, or they can keep the half of the \$20 as a token of their membership in the \$20 Club. Now I know there will be some negative "oooos" on this one but just try it. You might be surprised!

Prayer Mondays—Every other Monday beginning in September I will hold a mid-morning prayer time for any who wants to come. It will last up to an hour. We will study prayer and we will pray for those in need of prayer, for situations needing prayer, for our church, for our community, and for each other.

There is more to come.

WHO AM I?

I accompanied Paul when he went to Crete and helped him there as we brought the Good News. I was to catch up with him in Necropolis, but I didn't get there in time. He wrote me a Letter which is in the New Testament; it was intended as instructions for the church in Crete.
