At a reception near Christmas, a friend of fifty years announced in a private conversation that he was an

atheist and I shouldn't try to talk him out of his belief. What do you say to a person who declares they don't believe in God? What are the right words for the moment? I told my friend that no matter what he felt or believed about God, I still loved him and so did God. I told him God is used to being rejected and has tried repeatedly through history to overcome our running away, even resorting to sending his Son, that we might be able to come home to God, our father. I also told him that in our tradition, it wasn't my job to convince him of God, but to show him God in my life and to tell him what God had done for all of us. So, I proclaimed the great change God had brought to my life and the joy the rescue and redemption has meant to me.

I then shared with him how being a trial lawyer made me seek the evidence and study it. I accept as convincing the good news of four different Gospel writers, sharing the information they had been given (Mark and Luke) or had experienced first-hand (Matthew and John). I told him the fact that more than 500 people had seen the resurrected Christ was also convincing. I then remembered the promises and the prophecies of the coming Messiah and how the promises were fulfilled one by one in the testimony of the New Testament.

I then remembered so many secular writings, like the current best seller, *Is Atheism Dead?* By Eric Metaxas, which lays out the case for creation, saying it could not have just happened, but that an intelligent designer began it all. He accepts science's Big Bang theory of beginning, noting that creation had a beginning, meaning someone had to start it. His second premise is where did all the stuff come from that Banged? Again, an intelligent design, again creation, again proof for the God of Scripture.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK - CONTINUED

I told my friend of Metaxas' book and even left a copy at his door. I haven't heard from him yet, but his wife called to tell me he is reading it. As a Christian I pray for the Holy Spirit to convince him and take away his disbelief. I hope you can join in that prayer for so many who either reject God or limit God to a maybe. Christ has told us to tell the world and to show the world about the Good News.

Last word: I recommend the book to all. Your faith will grow as you read it.

WHO AM I?

I was one of the bright young men of Judah and was taken against my will to Babylon and held there to serve the King. I could interpret dreams and sometimes could tell what the dream was before the person who had it related the dream to me. I also had visions of the future and prophesied about the coming world powers of Persia and Xerxes, of Greece and Alexander, and of Rome, and its Emperors. I was imprisoned because I would not worship the imagery of foreign gods and I was challenged by many for the same thing as the years passed. I loved my Lord and stayed faithful to my God through it all. Three of my friends believed as I did, and they were thrown into a fiery furnace. But they lived, because the Holy Spirit was with them. My greatest prophecy, one God gave me to share, was the promise of the coming Messiah and the exact time He was coming. Who am I?
