Earlier this year the Congregational Care Committee of Session and I began work on a document which our members and friends could use to

convey to those who follow when we pass all of those things we wish we had said and done. The document is not a Will or a Power of Attorney or a Final Directive about extraordinary actions to keep us going in a last illness. Instead, it a host of instructions and thoughts about those things we wish we had written down, such as Funeral Plans, Obituaries, Next of Kin, Contacts, Accounts, Passwords.... The list goes on. There are over twenty categories.

The Document now exists and is called "A Last Gift" (For My Family and Friends). It is meant to be completed with your pastor. It is meant to be part of a short period of reflection with your pastor about your wishes. The intent is for it to be filled out by hand, with the original taken with you and stored in a safe place but not in a lock box or safe where immediate access would be denied. It is also the intent of the Committee that a copy be made while you are at the church, so that copy can be placed in a sealed envelope with your name on it and stored in the church's safe until needed.

The document can be changed in whole or in part at any time by doing it all over or by inserting a page or removing a page. It is in notebook form for that purpose instead of being in a bound form like a Booklet. The Committee encourages you to review it once a year thereafter, updating it as you wish. It is your Document, your Last Gift to loved ones and family. It is your blue-print to those who will have the job of settling your affairs.

It is not intended for computer fill out, as the time spent with clergy will help both be better prepared when the day of departure finally comes.

If you are interested in completing A Last Gift, please call the church office, where appointments of an hour each can be scheduled on certain Mondays of the month and on any

Because we thought this information would be of value church wide, we presented it to the Presbytery and it has been approved and is now available for dissemination Presbytery wide. Both Liz and I hope that what started here might bring peace and joy to so many others.

WHO AM I?

Some called me the greatest prophet. I doubt it, but I was willing to serve when the Lord asked, whom shall I send to warn my people of the tragedy that was coming unless they repented and of the hope that is coming in the Servant, the full revelation of the Messiah. My ministry began in 740 BC and ran through 701 BC. I was a contemporary of Amos, Hosea and Micah. I lived to 681 BC and saw many of God's prophecies come true. I am best known as the prophet of the coming Messiah. Handel used many of my verses in his music—The Messiah. My writings can be summarized as pronouncing judgment and offering hope of a future beyond imagination, a future that would come to pass in Bethlehem. Who am I?

Dear Friends in Christ,

When was the last time you felt good about anything? Or peaceful and secure? In today's world finding an answer to those questions might well give each of us pause. Amidst the strife and calamity glaringly featured in all media platforms there seems very little to take joy in or feel calm about. Wars and threats of war, natural catastrophes, widespread looting and thievery, random murder and violence, social injustice, political unrest - the list seems endless. How could anyone feel good and safe, much less take joy in living in today's world?

And yet, and yet, there is still much to be grateful for and many opportunities to experience joy. Chances are that if you think about it you will remember the last time you helped someone, friend or stranger, when they were in need. Or the time you were able to share talent and energy in a group effort to improve your community or to solve a local problem. The memories of these experiences that make us feel good and peaceful revolve around our pleasure in giving of ourselves.
