### Stated Session Meeting August 25, 2024, Electronic Vote August 28, 2024, Congregational Mg. September 8, 2024

### **Stated Session Meeting:**

Approved the minutes of the Stated Session Meeting June 23, 2024; ratified the Electronic Vote of July 2, 2024 and July 10, 2024.

Received the June and July Treasurer's report.

Approved the recommendation from Building and Grounds Committee to cancel the current contract with Jarratt Heating and Air Conditioning.

Approved the recommendation from Building and Committee for Mechanical Destination Company to repair the Sanctuary Air Conditioner.

Approved the recommendation from Building and Ground Committee for Cockade City Garden Club to use McIlwaine Hall and kitchen for the 2025 Historic Garden Day in Petersburg, on Tuesday, April 20, 2025.

Approved the Nominating Committee recommendation to reduce the congregational quorum from 20% to 10%.

Approved the Nominating Committee recommendation to reduce the number of Elders from 9 to 6 beginning with the Class of 2025.

The ratification is retroactive to July, 2009; Trustee's request to ratify the sale of 350 sq. feet of Boy Scout property to VDOT sold for a round-about. The ratification is retroactive to July, 2024.
